Worship

Celebrating God's presence together in worship services and in our daily lives.

Here are the words of invitation we use to welcome people to the table of the Lord: *"The Risen Christ has invited us to this table. Whoever you are, however you feel, for whatever reasons you are here, come to the feast. Whatever your condition, whatever questions you have, wherever you are on your spiritual journey: know that our host is the one who has given his life for the world, the one who was raised to new life, and the one who invites us to come to the table."*

Join us for worship with Holy Communion at 8:00am and 10:30am.

It takes the gifts and talents of many people to create meaningful worship in this place. Here's how you can help:

Prepare the worship space...

Altar Guild sets up the bread and wine for Holy Communion, cares for linens and vestments, and prepares the altar area for worship celebrations, including funerals and baptisms. If you'd like to help with Altar Guild, contact Sheri Buys.

Worship Environment Team works to enhance and amplify the seasonal worship theme and experience using all the senses. People with a variety of skills – planning, design, building, sewing, writing, photography, drama, or a willingness to roll up their sleeves and make it happen – are invited to plug into worship environment opportunities going forward. Make Music...

Kids Choir & Drums is for 1st through 6th grade children, who can sign up for choir, drums, or both! Choir is directed by Deb Wobig, and Drumming is directed by Kat Van.

Salt & Light is for 7-12th graders interested in music, drama, words, art and a variety of spiritual practices and is led by Jodi Gustafson.

This year you'll sign up for small, fit-into-your-schedule rehearsal sessions from 6-7pm on Wednesdays:

- **Session 1:** 9/19, 9/26, 10/3, 10/10, making music on 10/14 at the 10:30am worship service.
- **Session 2:** 10/24, 10/31, 11/7, 11/14, making music on 11/18 at the 10:30am worship service.
- **Session 3:** 11/28, 12/5, 12/12, 12/19, making music on 12/16 at 10:30am worship and on Christmas Eve at the 4pm worship service.

We will have optional Simple Dinner from 5:15-6pm for a nominal fee to make it easier for families to transition from work and school to church.

Adult Choir sings music from many different cultures and traditions. All voice parts are welcome and you don't need to be able to read music to have a great time! We help to lead worship three times in most months, alternating between early and late services.

Handbell Choir is for everyone post-high school. New ringers are always welcome. Some ability to read music is helpful, but we're happy to teach you if you don't know how yet! We ring in worship once a month, and rehearse on Sundays at 9am, and you can sign up for one session or the entire year.

Handbell Schedule

- **Session 1:** 9/23, 9/30, 10/7, 10/14, play on 10/28.
- **Session 2:** 10/28, 11/4, 11/11, 11/18, play on 11/25.
- **Session 3:** 11/25, 12/2, 12/9, 12/23, play at 10:00pm on Christmas Eve.

If you can't make regular rehearsals, but still want to make music, there's a place for you, too! We have several short-term opportunities through the year, and there's always room for soloists and instrumentalists. Let us know you're interested and we'll find a place for you!

For young children: Our nursery is staffed during 10:30am worship. Rainbow bags filled with quiet activities are available for young worshippers and are located next to the side doors to the sanctuary. A wiggle space is available in the narthex for caregivers to sit with their children during worship. To volunteer in the nursery, call Deb Denison. We ask those who utilize the nursery to volunteer their time.

Grow

Nurturing members of all ages to grow as disciples of Christ.

We believe that faith formation is a life-long journey where we truly are Always Being Made New! Check out these opportunities for all ages:

Children & Youth...

Sunday School: Children ages 3 to grade 6 meet on Sundays during the school year from 9:15-10:15am. Pre-Kindergarten children learn the classic bible stories, while 1-6th graders follow the scripture readings that are used in worship on Sunday mornings.



Confirmation: From September – May, 7-8th grade youth gather for confirmation on Sundays from 9:15-10:15am and Wednesdays from 7-8:30pm. For their third year of instruction, 9th graders join with 10-12th graders for CLASH and The Deep End for the majority of the year. Students typically affirm their baptism (are confirmed) in the fall of 10th grade.

CLASH and The Deep End: From September – May, 9-12th grade youth gather for CLASH (Christ Loves All Senior High) on Sundays from 9:15-10:15am, and The Deep End on Wednesdays from 7-8:30pm. CLASH and The Deep End include relationship building, topical conversation, bible study, service projects and fellowship events.

Summer Opportunities: Info about Vacation Bible School, Wapo Bible Camp, Boundary Waters Canoe Trips, and a high school mission trip is available in the Children, Youth & Family Handbook on the church website.

Registration and Medical Forms for preschool – 12th grade children and youth are on the church website.

Adults...

Faith & Life Conversations: From September – May, adults gather on Sundays from 9:15-10:15am in the Bethel Room for topical conversations and Bible studies that are relevant for living out our faith in daily life. The high school youth join in the Faith & Life Conversations on occasion for intergenerational learning.

Christ & Culture in Film: What's your story? Can contemporary films and fiction help us tell God's story and our own? Join with others for conversation around compelling literature and films (on a large screen). For more information, contact Glen Wheeler. The Faith Club: This group, for both men and women, meets during the school year on Wednesdays at 6:00pm in the church library and is ideal for those with children in music groups. If you are interested, contact Allan Hetland.

Rebecca Circle: This women's circle meets on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 1:30pm. For their monthly Bible study they use *Gather*, the magazine of the Women of the ELCA. Contact Bev Petersen if you would like to join them.

Animate Faith: Bringing together leading voices such as Nadia Bolz-Weber and Brian McLaren, this course explores central topics of Christianity through video, journaling and provocative questions. Library Committee: The mission is to stimulate and enrich Christian faith, to inspire, inform and entertain. There are resources and books for all ages, and periodic book discussions and author events are offered. Serve

Touching many individuals by providing services expressing the love of Christ.

Health Cabinet: The purpose of the Health Cabinet is to be a presence in worship and in the life of the congregation through learning opportunities, monthly blood pressure checks, the annual blood drive, and creating awareness of health and wellness issues. Contact Parish Nurse Barb Tauferner.

Hospitality Committee: Many hands are needed to help with our ministry of care to those in our community. Volunteers help with functions throughout the year such as weddings, funerals, and special events; as well as overseeing the care and cleaning of the kitchen. Contact Becky Dowzak to get involved.

Meals on Wheels: We deliver meals every 9 weeks to those who are shut in and less mobile than ourselves. Drivers are needed! Diane Smedstad has retired from her position as coordinator. Call the church office if you are interested in serving as co-coordinator!

Food Shelf: Drop your donations off in the Target Grocery Cart and mesh bins that are located in the church narthex. There are contribution envelopes in the grocery cart for donations that you can add to the offering plate during worship. Volunteers are always needed at the food shelf on Tuesdays from 10am-3pm. MinneHarvest: Assist Minnehaha United Methodist by distributing groceries at their MinneHarvest Food Mission, which is held on the 4th Saturday of the month. Contact Linda Ojeda or Diane (Slovik) Akerson for more information.

Loaves and Fishes: Volunteers serve a meal to approximately 250-300 working poor and homeless individuals at St. Stephen's Catholic Church. We serve 4 - 5 times a year on the 5th Monday of the month. Upcoming serving dates are October 29 and December 31, 2018. Contact Diane (Slovik) Akerson.

Affordable Housing: We provide shelter and hospitality to families experiencing homelessness through the **Families Moving Forward** program. St. Joseph's Home for Children: We collect gifts and money to be used at Christmas and throughout the year for children at St. Joseph's Children Home for Children beginning in November.
