READING Isaiah 6:1-8, NRSV



LORD'S PRAYER


You are invited to pray the Lord's Prayer using these printed words, or the words of your heart's choosing.



The Foundation provides educational grants to Lake Nokomis Lutheran members as well as funding for staff development, equipment purchases, and other one-time funding needs.

Educational grants are available to postsecondary college/university students who are actively involved, confirmed members of Lake Nokomis Lutheran. Educational awards are capped at \$1,000 per applicant per year. An educational grant applicant can apply for a maximum of four grants. Grants for staff development and other needs are awarded based on funds availability.
